*& How to get there*

## ALTE KONGRESSHALLE MÜNCHEN

**WHEN:** All Day Thursday

**WHERE:** Am Bavariapark 14, 80339 München

### GETTING THERE:

#### *From Munich Hackerbrücke (Central Bus Station)*

Go to the train ('S-Bahn') platforms. Take any city centre-bound train (look for the "stadteinwärts" signs to identify the correct platform) to Munich Central Station (1 stop). Check directions below to proceed.

#### *From Munich Hauptbahnhof (Central Station)*

Take the metro line U5 (direction 'Laimer Platz') at the sublevel of the central station. Get off after 2 stops (~2 minutes) at the stop 'Schwanthalerhöhe'.

#### *From Schwanthalerhöhe Metro Station*

It's a three-minute walk from the metro station to our venue. Follow signs towards the German Traffic Museum ('Deutsches Verkehrsmuseum'). The 'Alte Kongresshalle' is right behind the museum. Check the map in Annex I.





# BURG SCHWANECK

**WHEN:** For all committee sessions

**WHERE:** Burgweg 4, 82049 Pullach im Isartal



## GETTING THERE:

### *From 'Alte Kongresshalle'\**

Walk to the train station 'Heimeranplatz' (~ 13 minutes) and take the regional train line S7 (direction 'Wolfratshausen') for 12 minutes until the stop 'Pullach, Pullach (Im Isartal)'. Check directions below to proceed.

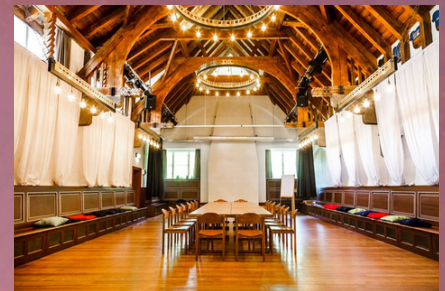
*\*For those sleeping at the Burg after the Thursday Social*

### *From Munich Hauptbahnhof (Central Station)*

Take the regional train line S7 (direction 'Wolfratshausen') at the sublevel of the central station. You'll reach your destination, 'Pullach (im Isartal)', after ~21 minutes. We recommend taking the train that leaves at 08:51 in the mornings.

### *From Pullach Train Station*

It's a nine-minute walk from Pullach train station to the burg. It's a simple route but we will also put up signs along the way to make sure no ones gets lost. Check the map in Annex I.



## Important things to note:

- There are only limited parking spots available at the burg.
- We recommend bringing a spare pair of shoes for the walk to/from the burg. Around 5 minutes of the walk are on non-paved roads that can be muddy.
- Smoking is strictly prohibited in and around the burg. To smoke you have to leave the premises.
- You are not allowed to eat or drink anything other than water inside the committee rooms. Please have your coffee, tea and food in the dining hall, lobby, hallways or garden.



# AGV MÜNCHEN

**WHEN:** Friday & Saturday Social

**WHERE:** Ledererstraße 5, 80331 München

## GETTING THERE:

### *From Pullach*

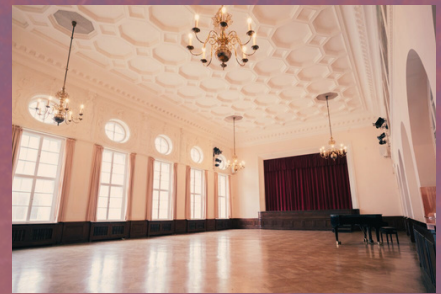
Walk to the Pullach train station. Take the regional train line S7 (direction 'Kreuzstraße'). You'll reach your destination, 'Marienplatz', after ~23 minutes. Check directions below to proceed.

### *From Munich Hauptbahnhof (Central Station)*

Take any of the regional train lines ('S-Bahn') going in the direction 'Marienplatz'. Get off at the second stop 'Marienplatz'. Check directions below to proceed.

### *From Marienplatz*

The Marienplatz train/metro station is underground. Exits C, D or H work equally well. From each of them it's a four-minute walk to the venue. Check the map in Annex I.



## Important things to note:

- Cash only!
- You need your IsarMUN wristbands to enter.
- Please also bring your ID.
- Security and our awareness team are on site.
- There's a place to hang your coats but it is not staffed and we cannot take liability for items stored there.
- You can smoke outside and re-enter but please be mindful of neighbours. You cannot take your cup/glass outside.



# KOLPINGHAUS TAGUNGSZENTRUM

**WHEN:** Closing Ceremony

**WHERE:** Adolf-Kolping-Straße 1, 80336 München

## GETTING THERE:

### *From Pullach*

Walk to the Pullach train station. Take the regional train line S7 (direction 'Kreuzstraße'). You'll reach your destination, 'Hauptbahnhof (Central Station)', after ~21 minutes. Check directions below to proceed.

### *From Hauptbahnhof (Central Station)*

Take the south exit (follow sign for 'Bayerstraße') on the long distance train level of the Central Station (not sublevel). It's a seven minute walk to the venue. Check the map in Annex I.





# TRANSPORTATION

## FINDING YOUR WAY AROUND

Munich has a very reliable and extensive network of metros, buses, trams and trains, operated by MVG and DB.

Popular alternatives to public transportation include Carsharing (Miles, ShareNow, Sixt), Scooters and Bikes (Bolt, Lime, Tier, Voi) and Taxis (Taxi via FreeNow, Uber, Bolt). Munich is also a very walkable city and it is safe to walk alone any time of the day/night. There are no areas that should be avoided or are unsafe.

Both Google and Apple maps provide accurate and reliable results for journeys in and around Munich.

## PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

All Venues and Socials are within the “Zone M” of the public transportation network. We recommend downloading the MVGO App, available on the App Store and Google Play Store, to check connections and buy tickets.



It is important to note that between 2 am and 5 am only limited means of public transportation are available.

If you don't have a “Deutschlandticket” subscription, we recommend buying a stripe ticket (Streifenkarte).

Stripe tickets cost 9,30€ for U21 tickets and 17,00€ for everyone over 21 and are valid for up to 5 rides within Zone M per Ticket. They can be used by multiple people if you validate the correct number of stripes. We recommend buying and validating the ticket in the MVGO App to avoid problems as the validation system can be confusing.

If you need to travel between the airport and the city, we recommend buying the ‘Airport-City Day Ticket’ (15,50€ individual, 29,10€ groups). The ticket will cover your travels in and around Munich for the whole day (until 6 am of the next day). Alternatives are taking the Lufthansa Express Bus (11,50€), renting a carsharing car (min. 30€) or taking a Taxi (75-100€).



# DRESS CODE

## Western Business Attire

The purpose of Model UN is to simulate the dialogue and diplomacy practiced at the United Nations. This includes a dress code that emulates what real-life diplomats wear at the United Nations.

Western Business Attire traditionally includes a business jacket or suit, dress slacks or skirt, dress shirt, appropriate hosiery or socks and dress shoes. Skirts and dresses should reach below the knees. For male presenting delegates it is obligatory to wear a tie. Jewelry and make-up should be kept simple.

Any manner of dress that includes T-shirts, jeans, athleisure, shorts, mini skirts, hats, athletic shoes (sneakers!) or any form of commercial advertising is not considered appropriate.



*While the traditional WBA dress code was conceptualized with a gender binary in mind and we do not have graphics available that derive from that we want to emphasize that IsarMUN strives to be as inclusive as possible. We encourage everyone to pick what they feel most comfortable with from the items of clothing that are dress code conforming.*

## Black Tie Optional

As the name suggests, a “black-tie optional” event is one in which guests have some flexibility in their attire while still maintaining a strict level of formality.

Black tie is a semi-formal Western dress code for evening events. It traditionally entails a tuxedo (dinner suit) for men and a floor-length evening gown for women. A tuxedo (tux) is a black, midnight blue or white two- or three-piece suit, distinguished by satin or grosgrain jacket lapels and similar stripes along the outseam of the trousers. It is worn with a white dress shirt with standing or turndown collar and link cuffs, a black bow tie, typically an evening waistcoat or a cummerbund, and black leather dress shoes or court pumps.

With a ‘Black Tie Optional’ dress code you may skip the tux and instead opt for a regular, formal suit. Instead of a floor-length dress a formal, cocktail-length dress is also acceptable.

## HOW TO GET TO MUNICH

### Deutsche Bahn

Flexible Deutsche Bahn train tickets can be bought for a reduced fare via our event-ticket link:

# Recommendations

## WHERE TO EAT

*Note: We'll provide lunch Friday, Saturday and Sunday and dinner on Friday. People sleeping at the Burg will get dinner there on Saturday.*

### Close to the 'Alte Kongresshalle' on Thursday:

*Note that most restaurants in the area offer 'business lunch' with prices ranging from 9 to 12 Euros for certain meals.*

- Notting Hill Café (huge bowls for ~ 12 Euros, vegan and vegetarian friendly)
- Ha Vietnamese Cuisine (pho, curry, different noodle or rice dishes)
- Cafe Westend (bavarian food but also salads, pasta etc.)
- Augustiner Bürgerheim (traditional Bavarian food)
- Café Lohner and Grobitsch (small café with changing menu)

### Close to the Saturday social:

*Note that 'Marienplatz' is a prime location for tourists and hence restaurants there are more expensive. For affordable restaurants try to avoid that area and go to 'Glockenbachviertel', 'Sendlinger Tor' or the University area.*

## WHAT TO DO

### Recommendations for Thursday morning:

- Theresienwiese – square famous for hosting the Oktoberfest
- Marienplatz – the heart of Munich, catch the famous ‘Glockenspiel’ (chimes) at 11 am and 12 pm
- Alter Peter – best view on the Marienplatz and only 1 Euro for students!
- Viktualienmarkt – market with specialities
- Frauenkirche – beautiful church in the center of Munich
- Englischer Garten – one of the biggest inner-city parks worldwide and definitely worth a visit
- Isar – the largest river that flows through the Englischer Garten
- Eisbachwelle – catch a glimpse of surfers in the middle of the city
- Ludwig-Maximilians-University – take a walk through the historical building
- Königsplatz – beautiful architecture from the 19th century

  - NS Dokumentationszentrum (history of Munich during the 1. and 2. world war)

  - BMW museum

Consult our 'Munich Recommendations', if the weather is nice we recommend that you catch the sunset at the 'Monopteros' in the Englischer Garten (city park).

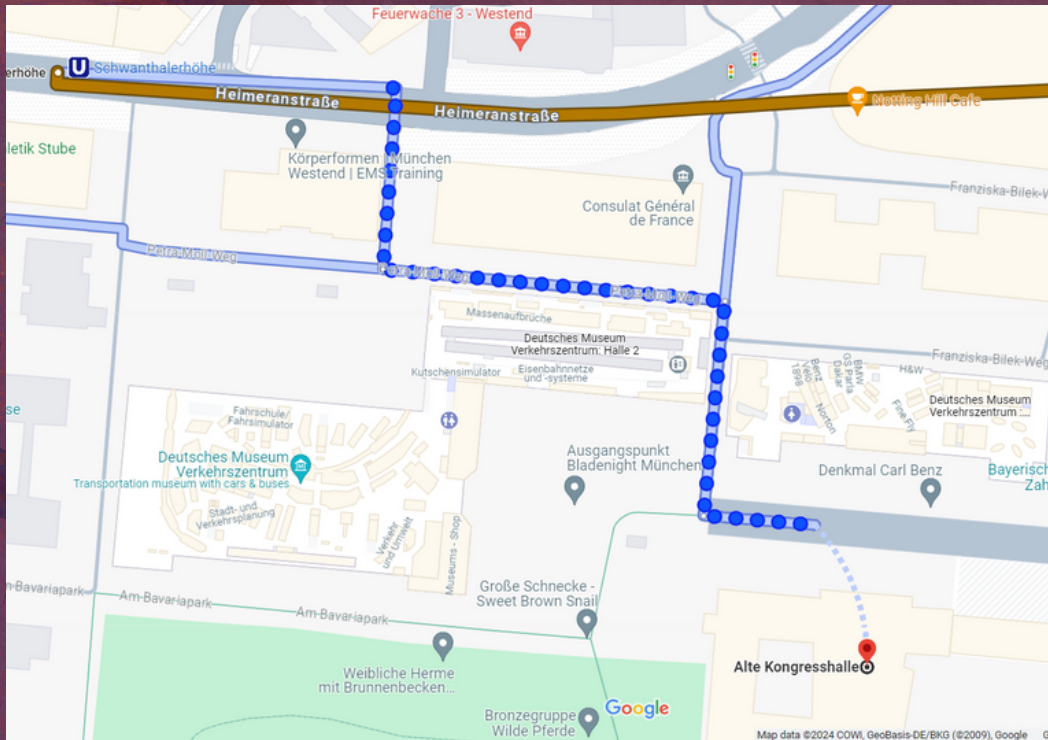

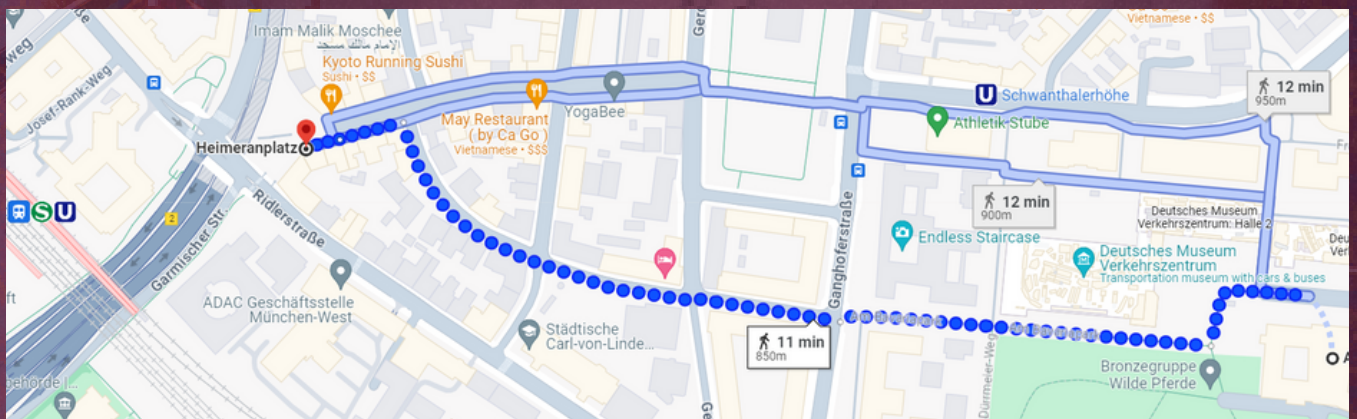

## Metro Station to 'Alte Kongresshalle' (Thursday)



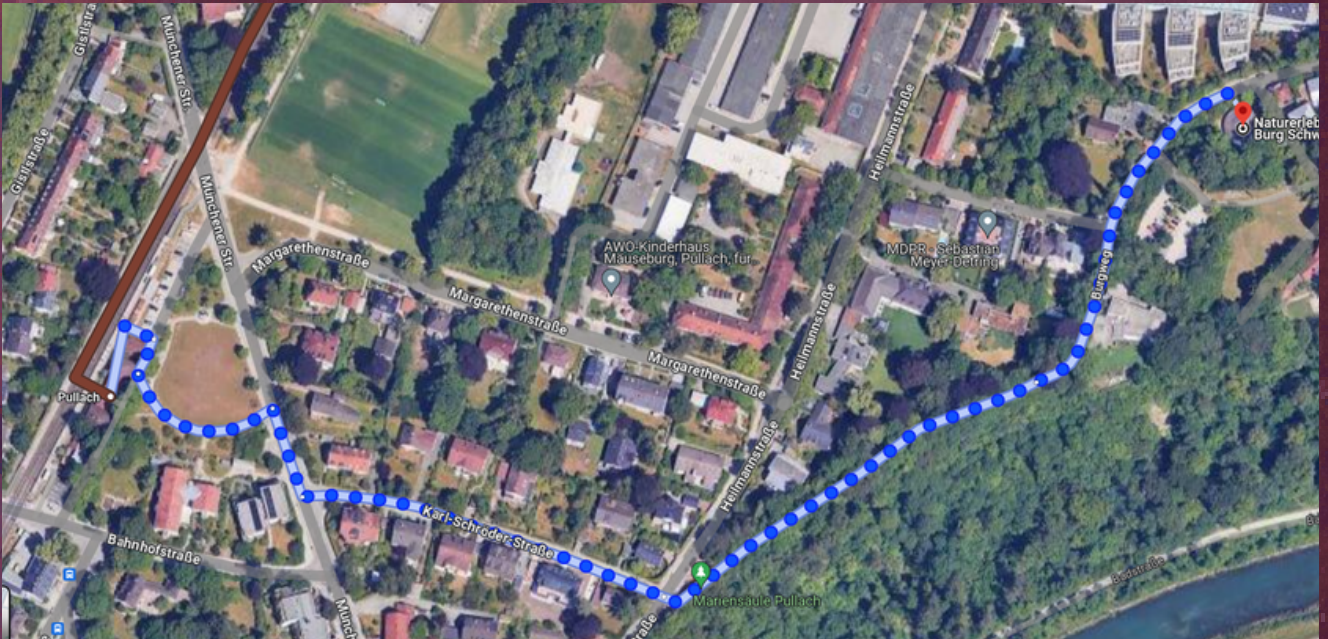

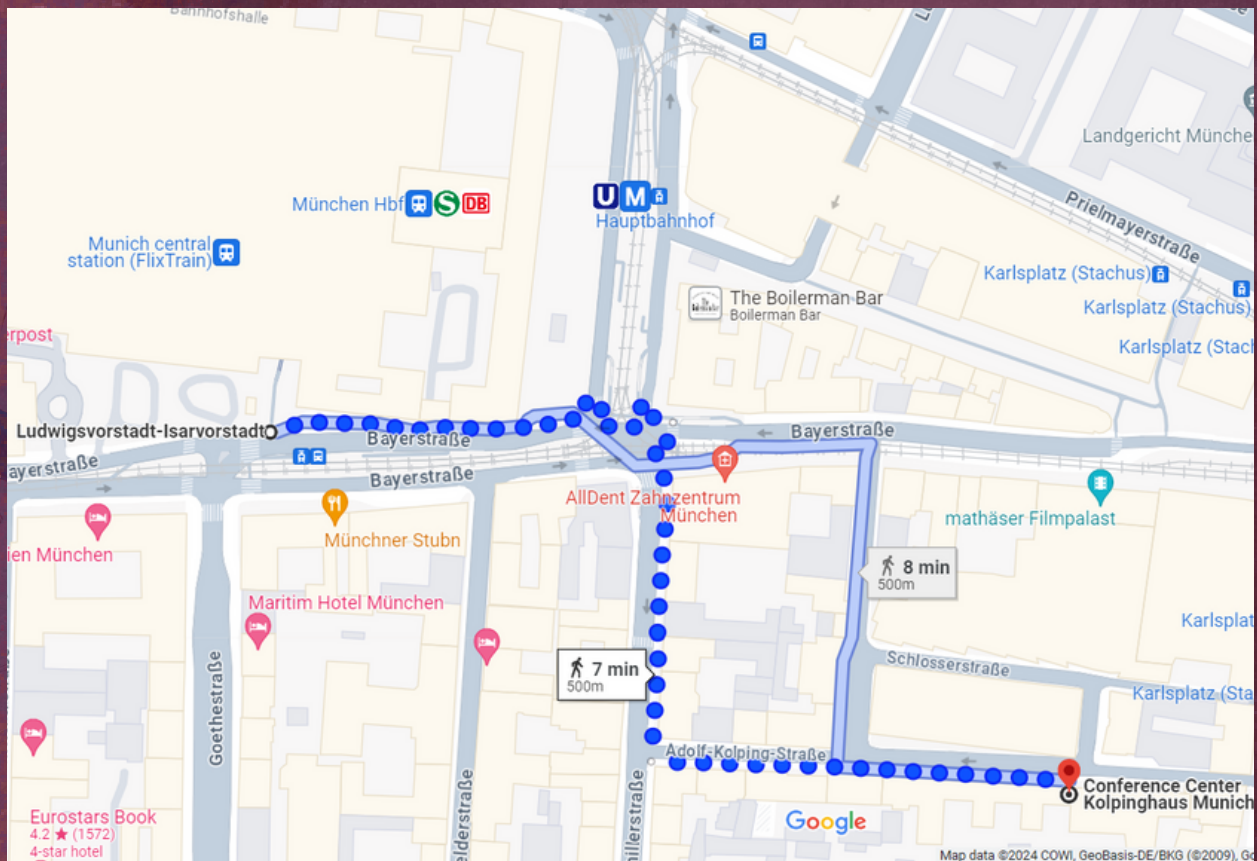
